Preventive care screening guidelines and counseling services for women

Get the care you need when you need it. Take this checklist with you to your next appointment.

A preventive health visit can help you see how healthy you are now and help find any health issues before they become more serious. You and your doctor can then work together to choose the care that may be right for you. Recommended preventive care services may include the following¹:

- Issues getting the medicines your provider prescribes.

Important Care

- Suggestions on how to improve your physical activity.
- Ways to help if you are feeling sad or blue.

Tests and Treatments

- When you will get results from labs, X-rays or other tests.
