Medical birth control*

These medical birth control services will be covered at no cost to you when prescribed and performed by a network health care professional. However, birth control products or drugs used as part of these services may be billed at full cost, unless they appear on this list.

Contraceptive counseling

To start, keep or stop the use of birth control services, products and drugs.

Diaphragms and cervical caps

IUDs (intrauterine devices)

Implantable rods

These flexible rods are implanted under the skin, and can provide birth control for up to 3 years.

Injectable contraceptives

Getting sterilized and anesthesia (including cutting or blocking the Fallopian tubes or oviducts, i.e. getting your tubes tied)

Surgical sterilization (getting your tubes tied)¹

^{1.} If a member is admitted to an inpatient facility for another reason (for example during maternity/delivery) and has a sterilization procedure performed during that admission, the sterilization or other contraceptive procedure fees are covered under the preventive benefit. However, the facility fees are not covered under the preventive care benefit since the sterilization or other contraceptive procedure is incidental to, and is not the primary reason, for the inpatient admission.
